"Once identity thieves steal your name, it's very difficult to clear up your credit history afterwards, so it is critical that you protect your personal information – proper shredding is at the top of the list!"

Shredding of transaction records, credit applications, insurance forms, cheques, financial statements, credit card statements, mortgage or other home information, payroll information, and tax returns is highly recommended. "We are 100% behind Delta Gymnastics' fundraising activity," added Laviolette. "We are proud when our members take the initiative to protect themselves and others in the community and we love the fact that the proceeds will benefit very hard working athletes who want the opportunity to represent their club in western and national competitions."

Delta Gymnastics athletes commit between 15 to 25 hours per week to perfect their skills. They have the opportunity to show their dedication and hard work during local, national and international competitions but it represents a big financial commitment to the families.
